CLUB PLANS WELL LIKED

MORE ENTHUSIASM IS EVINCED
THAN ENTHUSIASM.

Wide Field and Deserted Functions
Make Club Desirable Here.

More enthusiasm than the sanguine had anticipated marked the announcement in the Observer last night of the proposed formation of a University club in this city. The field for such an association is exceptionally broad and deserted at this time and when the new club is once gotten under way it will undoubtedly grow with great rapidity and soon come to include every eligible man in the city and county for the contour extends adjacent with that of the county's confines. During the week the prime movers in the plan will devise some tentative method of organization and submit it to a general meeting of interested parties.

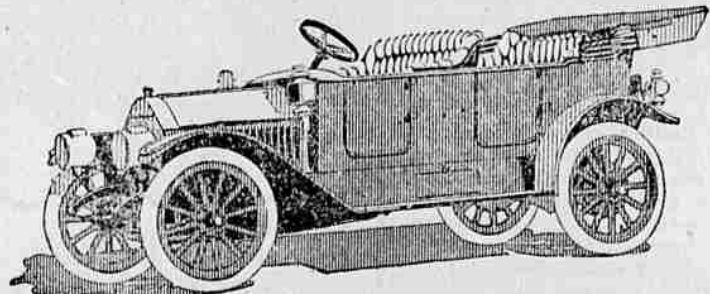
