MARK TWAIN'S ADVISER DEAD

BROTHER OF MRS. SHAMBOUGH DIES AT HANNIBAL.

Mark Twain Tested His Humor on the Late J. W. McDaniel.

The appended dispatch is taken from the New York World. Mr. McDaniel, the deceased, has a sister, Mrs. Lucy Shambaugh, living in La Grande. Mrs. Shambaugh is one of Mark Twain's early life friends.

Mark Twain's Adviser Dead.
 Hannibal Mo., Jan. 1.—James W. McDaniel, who was the first literary adviser of Mark Twain, was found dead in bed here today. In a magazine article published a short time before the death of Mark Twain, the author said when he first began to write humorous stories he always tried them out on McDaniel before he had them published. If the stories got a laugh from McDaniel, the humorist wrote, he always felt assured they would do.
