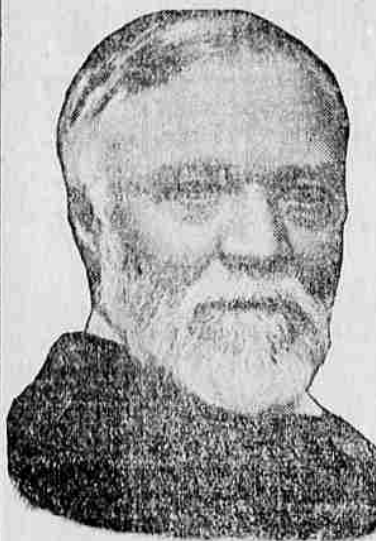
COAL FAMINE NOT FEARED

BASIC FIGURES OFTEN CHANGED

MEAT PACKERS COVERED PROFIT CLEVERLY.

By Changing Basis for Prices Were Able to Cover Up Real Earnings

Chicago, Jan. 11.—When the trial of the packers was resumed today Henry Meyers, chief auditor for the Armour company, was called to the stand. He described the packers' methods in determining the cost and prices of the output. He said the meats never sold below a margin of cost based on figures which he prepared. Then he acknowledged that the packing house heads frequently ordered him to change the cost figures. This, the prosecution says, shows how the packers, by figures, made it appear that the packing business was unprofitable.
