WAREHOUSE AT PORTLAND, PLAN

CO-OPERATIVE SCHEME FATHERED BY WOOL MEN.

Matter of Fixing Wool Sale Dates Also Discussed.

(Baker Herald.)

The executive committee of the Oregon Wool Growers' association met last night at which time the members discussed many matters pertaining to the sheep industry. The matter of establishing a co-operative wool warehouse in Portland by the time the Panama canal is completed was one of the principal things discussed. The object is to erect a warehouse where wool can be stored and then shipped east by water.

The details were not worked out but it was referred to a committee consisting of D. O. Lively, Portland chairman; F. A. Freeman, Portland; F. A. Phillips, Baker; Wm. Smith, Arlington; and J. E. Smith, Pendleton. The committee is expected to take the matter up at once and report at the next annual meeting of the association.

The committee also took up the question of fixing dates for the wool sales. No time was set but it will be announced later.

F. A. Phillips of Baker was elected a member of the executive committee, vice A. N. Whittier, deceased.

Mrs. C. H. Gage, of Portland, who is here in the interest of establishing a woolen mill in Baker was assured by the committee that they would be glad to have such a factory established and that there would be no difficulty in securing all the wool in this section providing the price paid would be equal to that which can be obtained by shipping.

NOTICE OF STREET IMPROVEMENT

TO WHOM IT MAY CONCERN: Notice is hereby given that in pursuance of a resolution adopted by the common council of the city of La Grande, Oregon, on the 27th day of December, 1911, creating a special improvement district, the property hereinafter described as such district and the council proposes to assess the cost of the sewer to the extent of the cost of an eight inch sewer, the amount of each property owner's assessment being stated in said resolution, the council will ten days after the service of this notice upon the owners of the property affected and benefited by such improvement, levy said assessment; that the boundaries of said district to be so improved are the exterior lines of the property hereinafter described as being benefited, viz:—

Blocks 115, 114, 113, 112, 111 and 110 of Chaplin's addition; Blocks 3, 4, and 5 of Coggan's addition; and tracts H, I, J, K, L, M, N, O, P, Q, R, S, T and U and block 12 of Coggan's second addition all in the city of La Grande, Union county, Oregon.

Notice is hereby further given that the council will levy a special assessment on all the property affected and benefited by such improvement for the purpose of paying for such improvement. That the estimated cost of such improvement is the sum of \$6,271.77. That the council will on the 17th day of January, 1912, meet at the council chamber at the hour of 8 o'clock p. m. to consider said estimated cost and the levy of said assessment, when a hearing will be granted to any person feeling aggrieved by such assessment.
