IMBLER DOWNED 55-10 POINTS

LA GRANDERS ROLL UP A LARGE MARGIN AT IMBLER.

Systematic Teamwork Spells Big Score for Visitors.

Fifty-five more tallies were added to the string of total points registered by the high school five this year, when at Imbler last Saturday night the local quintet smothered Imbler 55 to 10. A slippery floor did not blur the scoring machine's eyes in any respect and La Grande not only kept the scorers active but held Imbler down to two points—gained from free throws—until the last six or seven minutes of play, when, with a spurt of speed the Imblerites shot baskets from long and hard angles with a nice show of skill and returned confidence. The floor was too slippery for systematic footwork, but long passes and accurate throwing went far to make the game a brilliant one to watch. Goals from the field were frequently registered in two passes from the tossup in as many seconds. Bolton, Bohnenkamp and Woods in the order named got the baskets for La Grande and the trio, with the assistance of the guards, ambled around the floor with more basketball tact than has been seen at any game this year in which the team participated.

Imbler's chief handicap is stage fright. The youngsters are playing their first season and can't overcome the resultant lack of confidence. An element of hard luck, too, kept the score down for Imbler, as when the forwards would worm away from the close guarding of Ralston and Lottes they often missed easy goals. The game was entirely free from roughness and the best of feeling prevailed on both sides of the unbalanced contest.

LURE OF THE LAW.

The Craze For Litigation is America's Most Costly Folly.

If one were asked to name the costliest folly known in this country he would not be far from the mark if he should say it was the American craze for litigation.

In some communities, especially the small ones in rural districts, a man's importance seems to be measured by the number of lawsuits he has on hand, and he who has none is often regarded as a person of slight consequence.

But the habit of going to law is not confined to small neighborhoods nor to persons of trifling affairs, as a single instance will show. There is now in process of settlement in a neighboring state the estate of a man which at the time of his death was valued at \$1,000,000. Rival claimants to the property engaged in litigation, which has extended over a period of several years, and now, as the end approaches, it is said the estate has dwindled to about \$23,000.

Manifestly the parties to this litigation have made a heavy investment in experience; but, unhappily for them, it is not what financiers call a "liquid asset."—Docket.

MOONS OF THE UNIVERSE.

Besides Our Own Luna Twenty-five Others Are Known to Exist.

There are in all twenty-five moons besides our queen of night, Mars having two, Jupiter eight, Saturn ten, Uranus four and Neptune one, says the Philadelphia Public Ledger. Of course new lunar additions are likely to be discovered at any time, although it is improbable that Mercury and Venus have any satellites or that Mars has more than two.

The two known moons of Mars are, indeed, very minute, neither being over fifty miles in diameter. On the other hand, Jupiter's first four satellites, as well as Ganymede, are each larger than Queen Luna, Ganymede having a diameter of about 3,550 miles. Titan of Saturn possesses a diameter approximating 3,000 miles, while that of Neptune's sole satellite is about 2,000 miles. As respects our own moon, Queen Luna has only one-fortieth the size and one-eighty-first the weight of our earth. Luna's distance from us varies a good deal, from 221,000 miles to 252,000 miles. Her mean or average distance is about 238,000 miles.
