MEN SWINGING TO CHURCHES

BIRMINGHAM LEAGUE HAS HIGH HOPES.

Some Fruits of Men and Religion Forward Movement Noted.

Birmingham, Ala., Jan. 23.—(Special)—The Men and Religion Forward movement as organized for this city and surrounding territory, has practically all the live evangelical churches back of it, and is proceeding with unexpected force in its stage of preparation.

Under the direction of the local committee of one hundred there have been formed committees of six key-men from each church, who are showing their fellow church members just how to get to work in this extraordinary religious effort.

Surveys of social and religious conditions are well under way, the auxiliary towns are being awakened and organized and all will be ready for the eight-day campaign which begins on February 4th.

In referring to the Birmingham situation the general chairman, W. M. Cosby, expressed himself as more than satisfied with progress already made.

"We are convinced that this Forward Movement will make it possible," he added, "for more systematic and efficient work to be accomplished among men than any agency that has been started within the memory of the present generation. Certainly its object is both desirable and commendable, and impressed me in its incipency, that God was wonderfully moving the hearts of men by simultaneously impressing various Christian leaders of prominence in different parts of this country, that such a movement was needed to equalize the forces of the church by getting therein three million more men, that the number of men and boys may equal that of women.

"To accomplish this end is the object of the Men and Religion Forward movement. The leaders wisely saw that a number of evangelists sweeping over the land would not be a successful solution. It would take a systematic lubricating of the present church machinery, by securing specialists along certain lines of Christian work and let these men faithfully teach and train Christian men along these special lines in 90 cities of the United States, and these 90 cities, after being hundred smaller cities and these smaller cities to pass it on to the villages, thus making it a chain to reach all parts of this country.

"If the opportunity of this training is appreciated and taken advantage of by a large number of Christian men in the initial cities, of which Birmingham is one, I do not think there is any doubt that the aim of the originators will be accomplished in few years than we think."

In the course of a review of conditions here, one of the leading daily newspapers, the Birmingham Ledger, devotes the larger part of a page to telling just what has been accomplished thus far. Interviews with various men connected with the movement are published, including one with J. P. Stubbs, chairman of the committee on evangelism, who says that work along his special line has already been conducted aggressively.

"A series of meetings was conducted under the auspices of the committee by Dr. Clarence A. Barbour," he adds, "which were highly successful. These meetings were held in the downtown theatre and the churches and besides creating a great deal of interest for the movement a number of the men decided for Christ. The committee also conducted a series of meetings with Dr. J. I. Vance, of Nashville, Tenn., as the leader. One large union meeting was held in the First Baptist church and another rally meeting for men in the downtown theatre. All of these meetings brought splendid results. During the week of prayer noon day prayer meetings were conducted under the auspices of this committee. This committee now has plans under way to have every church organization in this city represented during the eight-day campaign. We expect, during the week of this campaign, to conduct noon meetings and other large platform meetings, where men will be given an opportunity to decide for Christ. Following this campaign the committee has plans already under way for the carrying out of the messages given by the expert on evangelism, and also to maintain aggressive work along all lines of personal evangelism."

Hugh F. Lattimer, chairman of the committee on auxiliary towns, said: "The Men and Religion Forward Movement has taken wonderful hold in

the cities and villages through the state of Alabama. The committee, a great many of whom are traveling men has been spreading the message of Men and Religion wherever they went so that there is hardly a city or village in the state that does not know something about this great movement that is stirring the hearts and changing the lives of men as nothing has ever done before. Many of our cities have already organized and nearly all of them will send in large delegations to the convention which is to be held in Birmingham February 7th and 8th. Through the kindness of a friend of the Men and Religion Forward movement, on whose heart the Lord laid the burdens of the needs of his fellows, we are enabled to maintain an auxiliary town secretary, J. A. Hugbins, who is now engaged in organizing the 14 centers where conventions will be held, immediately following the eight-day campaign in Birmingham. Birmingham will furnish these 14 centers with experts, who will give them the six messages of the Men and Religion Forward Movement. It is hoped by the organization, which this committee has now about perfected, that these wonderful messages will reach the smallest center of population in even the smallest center of population in the whole state."

J. E. Ramsey, chairman of the program committee, said: "I desire to add my endorsement to what has already been said regarding the Men and Religion Forward movement. It is a movement that appeals to all classes and conditions of men and should have the hearty support of every Christian man in this and every other city.

"The program committee, of which I am chairman, has not yet entered upon its duties, but will do so in the very near future. The work set apart for this committee is to arrange a program covering the eight days that the experts will be with us, so arranging the program as to time and place, that every man in and around the city will have an opportunity of hearing these experts and catching the spirit of the movement. Meetings will be arranged for in the center of the city and in all the outlying districts, as well as in the shops, factories and mills.

"We believe that the coming of this campaign is the beginning of better days for the churches of Birmingham."

John Taylor, of the boys' work committee, said:

"Our committee of ten has been at work for the past few months planning the greatest work in the world—boys' work—and have divided the city into five divisions, appointing two of our committeemen to be responsible for securing the names and addresses of all men actively engaged in boys' work in each division. This work has about been completed.

A number of meetings have been held in the different divisions for older boys and their leaders. These meetings have been conducted principally by boys, the addresses, prayers and songs being usually by boys.

"We are planning to assist in putting in motion in every church a live boys' organization to help save them, to take care of them socially and spiritually. There are three things we are trying to do for the boys in each church, to organize classes, to recommend a boys' club and to give them social life.

"We think the Men and Religion Forward movement means much for Birmingham."
