## FONDNESS FOR YOUTH FATAL

LITTLE FELLOW TOSSED UP AND IS INJURED.

Death Is Sequel to Friend's Over Indulgent Demonstration.

Rough bouncing of a youngster on his way to school by an over-indulgent admirer, proved fatal this week when Willie Freenor, the five-year-old son of Prof. and Mrs. F. J. Freenor, 1417 Adams, died from internal injuries sustained when thrown up in the air by a man who thought of aught else than to play with the youngster. About five days ago, Willie met an admirer on the street who picked up the youngster and tossed him up in the air, catching him again as he came down, but not without inflicting internal injuries from which recovery was not possible and the boy died last evening.

The sorrowing parents have the sympathy of all their friends. One younger son, Francis, survives to cheer the bereaved family.

The funeral will be held tomorrow from the Henry & Carr undertaking parlors and later from the Catholic church.
