GLEE CLUB IS COMING SOON

The Oregon Agricultural College Glee and Mandolin club will give a concert

here on Tuesday, February 20, in the opera house. The club has made great preparations for this appearance, and a program of unusual interest has been prepared.

This is the first year that the organization from the Oregon Agricultural college has taken a state wide tour, owing to the fact that formerly the club was not recognized by the college council and therefore could not secure the proper leave of absence for a trip. This year, however, in response to the great demand from the friends of the institution, who wrote letters, asking that the Glee and Mandolin club be allowed to appear in different cities of the state, the college council recognized the club and a two weeks' leave of absence was granted.

The Glee club has been enlarged from an organization of 16 voices, to one of 24. A large number of men appeared this year with voices of a quality never to be had before at O. A. C., thus enabling the club to undertake work which would have been impossible before from lack of numbers and volume. Conscientious work on the part of the men has brought the work to a high state of efficiency.

The Mandolin club, with 12 members, has, under the leadership of Mr. Chas. Brewster, worked up an interesting program, of a character to please the most critical, and have drawn hearty echoes upon every appearance. They will without doubt prove to be one of the best attractions ever scheduled in this city.

The program which has been prepared for the audience is one which will prove to be of great interest to all patrons. The repertoire includes the latest compositions of both classical and popular nature. Among the former are such pieces as the "Blue Danube Waltz," by Strauss; "Comrades in Arms," by Adam; "Lovely Night," from the "Love-Tales of Hoffman," by Offenbach; "On the Sea," by Buck; and "Ciribiribin," by Pestalozzi. Besides these a large number of humorous pieces have been mastered and will be used largely for encore work, as well as on the program. The entertainment ends with a "Collegiana," arranged for the club by two of its members, Mr. S. H. Boddingshouse, and Mr. Raymond Coursea.

Undoubtedly one of the most pleasing features of the evening will be the Scotch monologues, which will be given by Mr. Henry Russell, the "Harry Lawler of the west." Mr. Russell renders these sketches with all of that fascinating humor of the Scot. He will appear in costume worn by his ancestor across the water.

The accompanist of the club, Mr. Raymond Coursea, of Portland, and son of the leading musician of that city, will play a piano solo. Long study and experience has developed in him an artist of unusual calibre, and his performance never fails to enrapture the audience.

An expert trombone soloist is with the club this year, and will appear on the program in solo work. He is Mr. Edwin Woodcock of Corvallis. Mr. Woodcock has been a member of the O. A. C. cadet band for the past three years, and this experience, with careful study and training, has eminently fitted him for work before the most critical audiences, and his number will prove one of the best of the evening.

The O. A. C. octette will appear with a number. The octette is made up of the best voices in the club, and their work is of unusually high character. On the whole, the entertainment here next Tuesday evening will be one of the finest ever heard here, and those who fall to come will miss a rare treat.
