Parts Carried Out in Fine Shape—Success Marked Every Way.

The presentation of June Andrews' drama, "Hazel Manor," by the M. I. A. Dramatic club and Miss Ethel Bean's

appearance in monologue proved a big success and marks a big step of advancement in stimulating the development of local talent. In spite of the drizzling rain the amusement hall was filled with spectators, many being obliged to stand. The appreciation was shown by the frequent applause given.

Miss Jennie Carbine as Inez Merlin (the judge's niece), showed exceptional talent in the part, which allowed large scope for amateur acting.

while Walter Gibbons as the judge was even better than in his former appearance. E. W. Carbine proved to be an ideal lover in reading the lines of Lyle Burns. Mr. Carbine and Mr. Gibbons have had some little experience on the amateur stages before.

The character of Black Crutis, the villain, as represented by V. Bean was very interesting and afforded natural opportunities for clean and good wit from Frankie Combs with her kitten, as "daisy." Charles Mills as "Tommy" always brought a ripple of laughter throughout the audience. Kate Pixton as "Annie Deal," showed exceptional talent in the pleasing way she represented the part. Ray Baum, although reading but one line as the "detective," did that in a very creditable manner. The action of the play was quick but all were equal to the occasion, putting a feather of success in their caps which is lasting.

Miss Ethel Bean, in monologue, proved to be no amateur along this line. In the tragedy, "Michael Scroggins," she held the audience in a spell which was not broken until after she had finished, while in the reading of the comic sketch afterward, she was a scream from start to finish.

The whole entertainment was carried off without a hitch and the continuous applause speaks loudly of what the M. I. A. club did.
