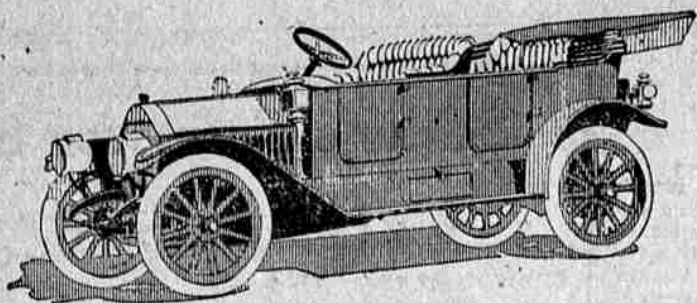

ELLIS DECIDES TO TRY AGAIN

PORTLAND PAPER ANNOUNCES CANDIDACY OF JUDGE.

Former Representative to Become a Candidate for Office Again.

Ex-Congressman W. R. Ellis of Pendleton, who has been in Portland for several days feeling out the political situation, has decided to make the race for the republican nomination for congress in the Second district. While Mr. Ellis refused to admit today that he is definitely in the race, it is known that the question was settled at a conference last night at the Imperial hotel, and that the standpat Taft element in the party will line up practically solidly behind the Umatilla county statesman. The entrance of Ellis into the field makes five candidates already announced in the Second district, with a strong probability that another will declare within the next few days.

As at present lined up the republican candidates are N. J. Signott of Wasco; J. P. Rusk of La Grande; C. E. Roosevelt, of Pendleton, who filed today; George T. Cochran, of La Grande, and W. R. Ellis of Pendleton. Friends of John W. McCulloch, of Ontario, district attorney of Malheur county, expect that he will announce before the time for filing declarations expire.

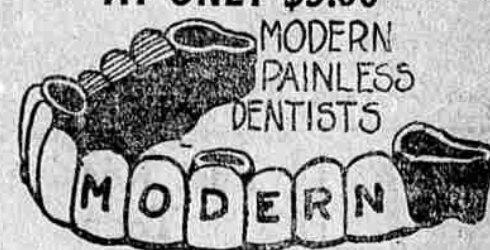
