General election will be held on November 5.
Primary election will be held on April 19.
At the general election will be elected president, vice president, one United States senator, congressman for new Eastern Oregon district, secretary of state, sheriff, clerk, assessor, treasurer, coroner, surveyor, commissioner, justices of the peace and constables, recorder, superintendent of schools, dairy and food commissioner, railroad commissioner (2nd district) state representative, Union and Wallawa counties senator from Union and Wallawa counties, representative from Union County joint senator including Union Malheur and Morrow counties.
At the primary election parties will nominate for same offices and in addition will express their choice for president and vice president and will elect delegates to their national conventions.
Registration closes on April 3.
Last day for candidates to file nominating petitions, April 4.
Registration reopens April 29.
Closes for last time May 15.

BRITTON CHILD NOT RECOVERED

STORY PUBLISHED AT ELGIN IS DENIED.

Mr. and Mrs. Britton Dispute Story That Child Has Been Found.

(Pendleton Live Wire.)

Emphatic denial of the story published by the Elgin Recorder to the effect that Cecil Britton, kidnapped more than five years ago, had been found is registered today by the parents of the boy. The entire country was aroused by the disappearance and every effort was made to locate the child. Until last week nothing was heard of him, and then the Elgin Recorder declared that he had been found. This paper reprinted the Recorder's story, bringing forth the following denial:

Walla Walla, Wash., Feb. 12, 1912.
Editor The Live Wire,
Pendleton, Ore.

Dear Sir: In an issue of your paper under date Feb. 10, there appeared an article copied from the Elgin Recorder, stating that the circumstances surrounding the mystery of the kidnapping of Cecil Britton had been cleared.

That article is absolutely false from beginning to ending. As to us having our little son we are sure we would not be ashamed of him, but would be only too glad for everybody to know it, especially our kind friends who stood by us so loyally in the search at the time he disappeared. We have friends far and near who would rejoice with us if we had our child, but we have not and only pray to God that we will soon get him, as it has been almost six years since he disappeared.

Baldwin, adjutant at the post, a brace of loaded revolvers, an electric flashlight, a jimmy and a fully equipped drill, also a quantity of high explosives. Adjutant Baldwin says the new convert is well connected in Utah, Nevada and California and that his parents are well to do and highly respected in the community in which they reside in the state of Utah.
