City School Items

Dr. Dean Priest, ex-president of the University of Washington, addressed the grade and high school pupils Friday forenoon on "The Greatness of Lincoln." He pointed out the fact that Lincoln would be as popular today if he were living, as he was in his own time, for the reason that he loved and worked more for his fellowmen than for himself.

Dr. Mathes has made arrangements through Prof. Montgomery, to deliver a stereopticon lecture in the high school auditorium March 6. He derives his subject, Alaska, from a 23 day trip among the land of the glaciers. With 75 slides he will show the scenery he saw while on an excursion, without the usual accompaniment of cold feet. and wireless telegraphy. Dr. Patty has been in the research work for some time and is bound to produce an interesting entertainment in his line.

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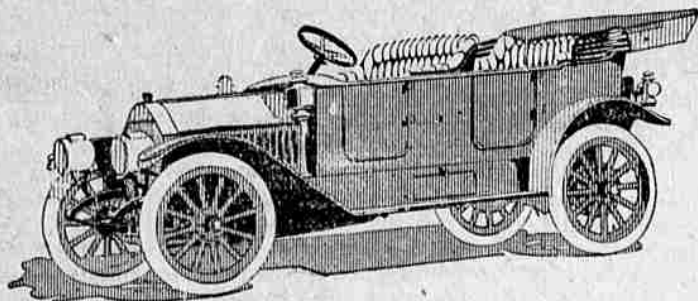
