C. D. HUFFMAN WANTS THE ROAD
BILLS READ.

Points Out His View of Best Road
Building Methods.

La Grande, Feb. 20.—(To the Editor.)—Much is being said and done along the line of good roads, and as is always the case, some want to go to extremes, bond the earth and build them all at once, while others are willing to tax themselves and build as they are able. I find it always safe to go with the conservative class—in- stead of jumping in and trying to build rock or macadam roads every- where let us try to learn some other ways, by mixing soil or clay and sand, learning how to use log drags, etc., as is successfully done in other states.

It is said there are three classes of people boosting this good roads move- ment—those who want to sell road machinery, those who want to buy the bonds and the automobile push.

The road the farmer wants is from the farm to the market; learn the best kind of roads to build, and make them as fast as they can pay for them. There is no such thing as a perma- nent road—the history of road build- ing is that repairing begins almost as soon as the road is finished.

I am in favor of each county build- ing its own roads, paying for them as they choose—by bond, direct tax or warrants.

For state roads or interstate roads

government aid, the same as rivers and harbors are improved.

I desire to call the attention of the voters to the fact that there will be two sets of good roads bills on the ticket this year, one by the Pacific Highway association, or committee ap- pointed by the governor, whom I un- derstand have agreed on the measures they will initiate, and those offered by the grange and endorsed by the Farm- ers' union and Federation of Labor. Read these carefully before you vote.

TIMELY HINTS FOR FARMERS

Red Clover In Rotation.

One reason for the great popularity of the red clover plant is the ease with which it lends itself to the rota- tions which have been practiced in the sections to which it is adapted. The fact that it lives but two years necessitates a rather short rotation on the farm, especially when the clover is seeded alone.

Meadows and pastures containing clover and grass mixed are usually held three or four years, even though very little clover may remain during the last year or two. The value of red clover on the farm makes it usu- ally desirable that a considerable area of the farm be at all times seed- ed to this crop.

The Illinois experiment station has shown as a result of a thirty year test that corn on land continuously has produced twenty-five bushels to the acre, corn alternated with oats forty-three bushels, while corn, oats and clover in a three year rotation gave a yield of fifty-nine bushels for the corn.

Sandy Soils Need Humus.

The addition of vegetable matter to sandy soils is very important since it is needed to increase their water hold- ing capacity as well as to add fertility. Water is often the limiting factor in the production of sandy soils, due to their coarse texture and lack of veg- etable matter. To prevent winds blow- ing sand the land may be laid out in long, narrow fields with alternate grass and cultivated crops. Protection wind- breaks of pines or other trees are ef- fective for short distances.

Legumes are beneficial to sandy soils because they supply the much needed nitrogen as well as humus. Peat can be used to advantage as a nitrogen fer- tilizer where a supply is readily avail- able. The use of lime on sandy soils, which are very commonly acid, will aid in securing a stand of alfalfa and clovers. Inoculation is also usually necessary to grow good crops of le- gumes.

Be Gentle With Cows.

The milk cow must be treated with kindness at all times. A cow that is always in fear of her attendant cannot possibly make her best record. The good talker is a highly nervous ani- mal, and harsh treatment will cause a falling off in milk yield. At no time should a dog be allowed to run the cows, and noise and blows should be avoided. The cow should feel perfect- ly safe in the care of the man whose duty it is to look after her welfare. She should have confidence in him, and he should treat her in such a manner that she is induced to seek his pres- ence rather than be alarmed and run away at the sound of his voice.—Farm- er's Advocate.

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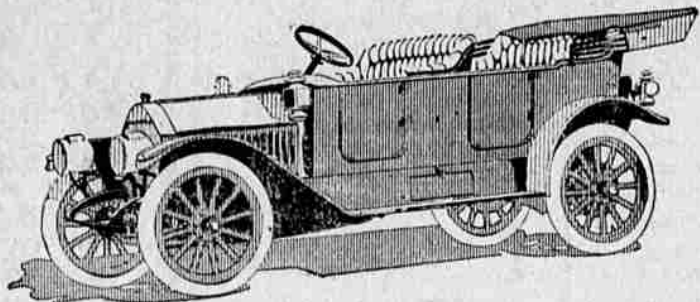
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
