## LOCAL FEEDER HOLDING STOCK

OVER SIX HUNDRED HEAD ARE READY FOR SHIPMENT.

Condition of Portland Market Indicates Rise in Prices Soon.

Over 600 head of cattle fed by J. D. McKennon will be turned on the Portland market when prices are right. About 900 cattle have been fed during the winter at the sugar factory yards by Mr. McKennon and from time to time shipments have been made that reduced the total to something over 600. Judging from the condition of the stock market in Portland yesterday the lack of supply to all the demand will probably make it profitable for the local feeders.

Book Without Errata. A London publisher once determined to publish at least one book which should be faultless in the matter of errata. He had the proofs corrected by his own proofreaders with the greatest care until they had exhausted their skill and patience and assured him that there were no longer any errors to be eliminated. Taking duplicate proofs of the last revise, he sent them to the universities and other large publishing houses, offering large money prizes for each error discovered. A few errors only were found, and after every one had a chance to detect any additional errors the plates were made, the book printed, expensively bound and sold as an absolutely perfect book and unique in all literature. For a long time this was conceded, but six or eight months after its publication a letter called the publisher's attention to an error in a certain line and page. Later a second was announced, and before the first year had elapsed some four or five errors had been reported.—Charles Winslow Hall, in National Magazine.

Natural Turkish Baths. Preston, Ont., about seventy miles from Toronto, enjoys natural Turkish baths. Near the town is a lake the waters of which are impregnated with sulphur and other chemical properties. The lake is government property, and the cost to those availing themselves of its virtues is merely nominal, about sixpence being sufficient to remunerate the services of the halfbreeds preparing the bath. This is taken in what is locally called a "sweat lodge." The lodge is made by digging a hole four feet deep, lining it with small bowlders and covering it with an air proof tent. A fire is then built in the hole and kept burning until the stones are thoroughly heated. Water from the lake is sprinkled on the hot stones, and a steam arises which is laden with medicinal properties.—London Graphic.

## A Little Sermon on Health

AN ADVERTISEMENT, NOT BY ELBERT HUBBARD. Ask your doctor the most important thing toward keeping "fit," and he will say, "breathe plenty of fresh air—sleep with your windows open." Ventilation is absolutely necessary in any room where people live. The air must be kept pure and free from contamination, and the quantity of oxygen must remain normal. Otherwise, the rooms feel "close" and "stuffy" and discomfort, headaches and often more serious things are the result. Anything that destroys or contaminates the oxygen in the air you breathe is a menace to your health. Kerosene lamps, for instance. Try this: Close your windows and light a kerosene lamp; go out and shut the door; come back in half an hour; notice how "close" and "stuffy" the room feels—how difficult it is to take a long breath. The lamp has burned up the oxygen in the air and has given off a poisonous gas. Oxygen is the element in the air that supports life, and we require a given amount of it every time we breathe. Now try the same test with an electric light. The air remains pure and wholesome because the electric light burns in a vacuum. Nothing then, nothing but an electric light should be used in the living room, the bedrooms, or the sick room. When people realize this they are not going to be satisfied with kerosene lamps.
