ELKS RALLY TO ELK PROTECTION

PERSONAL LETTERS APPEAL TO THE MEMBERSHIP.

Arrival of Elk Herd Delayed Until Early in March, Say Reports. Every member in La Grande lodge No. 433, B. P. O. E., will receive a personal communication from the officers of the lodge looking toward the proper care and preservation of the band of 15 elk that will be shipped from Jackson's Hole to Billings Meadow in a government reserve in Wallowa county. It was believed last week that the shipment of 15 head would reach La Grande last Saturday or Sunday but it is now announced that the elk will not be taken from Jackson's Hole until March 1.

All Elks Are Assistants. The letters issued a day or two ago urge that every member of the lodge assist individually and collectively in the proper preservation of these elk. The letter urges that each member devote personal attention in reporting to game wardens any infraction of game laws and assisting the game wardens in protecting the life of the elk on this range. Not only should all Elks report in to game wardens any infractions of the law that they may know of, but they are asked to acquaint the La Grande lodge of such fact in which case action against the guilty or suspected parties will be instituted.

La Grande Is Parent Lodge. Because the La Grande lodge is located geographically nearer to the Billings Meadows where the 15 elk will graze, and it is hoped, propagate prolifically, the local lodge has taken it upon itself to lead other lodges in the state in the protection of these elk, as it was primarily this lodge which instituted the investigation leading to the discovery that elk could find climatic protection here that was far better than that provided in Jackson's Hole, the present elk preserve. If these 15 elk succeed well, others will be planted on ranges nearer to La Grande. J. H. Peare is now busy mailing out these personal appeals, and said today that he and the lodge committee as well as the entire membership of the lodge would be organized into a well-formed band of elk protectors at once.

LA GRANDE GIVES AID.

Cash Assistance Lent to State Fund by Lodge No. 433. Yesterday afternoon La Grande came in for "front page" space in the

Portland Telegram when that publication issued the following bit of information:

Approving the course of Portland lodge in subscribing \$100 toward the fund of \$1,000 needed to take care of the herd of 15 elk which the government is to transplant to a fenced pasture on the Wallowa reserve, La Grande lodge, No. 433, Benevolent and Protective Order of Elks, has donated \$25 to help swell the amount. A warrant for \$25 has been received by the Telegram from Secretary H. E. Coolidge in response to a suggestion of Game Warden Finley.

Letters have been addressed to all the Elk lodges in the state by Mr. Finley, asking them to subscribe to the Elks' maintenance fund. All who desire may send subscriptions to the Telegram instead of to the game warden, but in any event they will be properly acknowledged and reach the same source. The elk are to be given by the government with the understanding that they shall be placed on a suitable range and properly protected.

Arrangements for transportation of the animals have been completed, according to a letter received yesterday by Game Warden Finley from Dr. T. S. Palmer, assistant chief of the biological survey, Washington, D. C. Objections of a few sheepmen of the district are regarded as of no weight, for the reason that they merely want favors continued which they have been granted for years.

Dr. Palmer writes that instructions have been given to wardens to pick out 15 of the largest and healthiest elk available, four bulls and 11 cows. They will be crated separately and shipped from Jackson's Hole about March 1, and are expected to arrive at Joseph, Or., about March 15. For 80 miles they will be conveyed in wagons, to the Oregon Short Line, and Game Warden Finley is now negotiating with the officials of that company for a special rate on the animals.
