ORDINANCE NO. 585, SERIES 1912.

An ordinance requiring permits to be secured from the recorder before commencing the construction, enlargement, repair, removal or alteration of any building, structure, or any part thereon in the city of La Grande, Oregon, prescribing a penalty for the failure to secure the same and declaring an emergency.

WHEREAS, a large number of buildings have been built, or other improvements have been made to struc-

tures in the city of La Grande in the past, and no record of the same, or the cost thereof has been made, and WHEREAS, it is necessary for the public welfare that such information be obtained and kept for the information of the people of the city and the general public;

Now therefore:

The city of La Grande does ordain as follows:

Section 1. Before commencing or proceeding with the erection, construction, enlargement, alteration, repair, or removal of any building, structure, or any part of such work a permit therefor shall be first obtained from the city recorder by the owner or his agent, or the architect in charge of the work, and it shall be unlawful to commence or proceed with any such work until such permit shall have been first obtained.

Section 2. Application for such permit shall be made in writing to the city recorder upon blank forms furnished by the city of La Grande; said application shall state the estimated cost of such building, structure, or other work, the locating and intended use thereof, with a pertinent description of the land or lot upon which the same is or will be located, the name of the owner and street and of each or all of the owners thereof.

And the detailed statement or application shall be kept on file in the office of the recorder of the city of La Grande, Oregon, and the substance thereof entered in a book kept for that purpose, in such detail as to make the information contained in the applications readily available for public use and convenience. The fee for said permit shall be 50 cents to be paid by the applicant and turned into the general fund of the city.

Section 3. Any person violating the provisions of section one of this ordinance, upon conviction before the recorder of the city of La Grande, Oregon, shall be punished by a fine of not less than \$5.00 nor more than \$50.00 and in default of payment shall be confined in the city jail not to exceed one day for every \$2.00 of such fine.

Section 4. Inasmuch as this ordinance is necessary for the immediate preservation of the health, peace and safety of the city of La Grande and its inhabitants in this: that the public welfare will be promoted by the keeping tabulating and publication of the information herein required to be kept, therefore a nemerency is hereby declared to exist and this ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after its passage, approval by the mayor and publication in one issue of the La Grande Evening Observer on and after the 1st day of March, 1912.

Passed the council by eight councilmen voting therefor, on the 21st day of February, 1912.

Approved this 23rd day of February, 1912.
