City School Items

The advanced botany class sterilized potatoes this week which they exposed to four tests for bacteria: to outside air, to inside air, to drinking water, and to the dust from the floors.

After an exposure of ten minutes the air tests proved very satisfactory. In no case was there any bacteria found, showing the benefits of good ventilation. The result of the water test was also very pleasing, demonstrating La Grande's sanitary water system. The dust test, as could be expected, showed an enormous growth of bacteria.

The foregoing is the report issued by Prof. Montgomery, who said in conclusion: "In another year I hope to have the apparatus whereby the high school students can make a complete analysis of water to show definitely the presence or absence of typhoid germs in our drinking water." Prof. Montgomery states that such an apparatus is practically inexpensive and is needed to complete the laboratory equipment of the botany class.

At a class meeting Tuesday morning the seniors decided to issue a high school annual. Merlin Batley was chosen editor-in-chief and Lee Reynolds, business manager. This will be the first annual to be put out by the La Grande graduates and promises to be a credit, not only to the seniors, but to the whole school as well. Those chosen to take charge of the work are well qualified to see that the book is well done and the support of the high school and community is assured.

Wednesday evening Dr. Van Patten delivered a very able and scholarly address before a good sized audience, on the subject, "A Trip to Oberammergau." The lecture was very clear throughout and his hearers displayed a great deal of interest in his topic.

The civics class has been studying the city charter for the past week. The present "Women's Rights" agitation serves as an excuse for interesting all the students in the matter.

The teachers' training class has finished the writing method of teaching geography and are now deep in the mazes of the reading method.

The sixth month of school came to a close Friday when the teachers handed in their monthly reports.

The sixth graders spelled those of the seventh grade off the floor Friday afternoon.

Dr. Seemann has been selected to preach the baccalaureate sermon for the class of 1912.
