BAKER STUDENTS THRASH "PROF"

HIGH SCHOOL INSTRUCTOR IS SET UPON BY BOYS.

It Is Said That His Attentions to Co-Eds Are Ungentlemanly.

A Baker dispatch says: After visiting a young woman last night, G. R. Mullen, an instructor in the high school here, was set upon by five young men students of that institution last night and was trounced severely. The assailants of the pedagogue are sons of prominent families here and declare they acted as champions of girl students of the high school, who, the youths say, have complained that Professor Mullen subjected them to undue and unseemly attention.

The students who waylaid the instructor did not attend class this morning. The fighting students are said to be Robert Finkelberg, Leslie Frack, Loring Hyde, Herbert Lillig and George McCord. McCord is a member of the senior class and was captain of last year's football team. All the others belong to the junior class.

Professor Mullen has retained an attorney to prosecute his assailant.

While the upper class pupils of the high school are reticent about discussing Professor Mullen and actions of his that are said to have led to last night's assault, others are voluble in complaining against him. Several say he made himself unbearable by foisting his attention upon girls after they repulsed him and that thereafter he made their class work difficult for them in retaliation.

Among others, no complaint was heard concerning Professor Mullen's alleged attentions to the girl students, but they declared the instructor brought down the ire of the students upon himself by arranging a dance which was held the same night set for the concern of the high school glee club.

The school authorities thus far have shown no disposition to take up the case.

Professor Mullen is a new member of the faculty.
