FACTS ABOUT REGISTRATIONS IN 1912.

- General election will be held on November 5.
- Primary election will be held on April 19.
- At the general election will be elected president, vice president, one United States senator, congressman for new Eastern Oregon district, secretary of state, sheriff, clerk, assessor, treasurer, coroner, surveyor, commissioner, justices of the peace and constables, recorder, superintendent of schools, dairy and food commissioner, railroad commissioner (2nd district) state representative, Union and Wallowa counties senator from Union and Wallowa counties, representative from Union County joint senator including Union Matheur and Morrow counties.
- At the primary election parties will nominate for some offices and in addition will express their choice for president and vice president and will elect delegates to their national conventions.
- Registration closes on April 3.
- Last day for candidates to file nominating petitions, April 4.
- Registration reopens April 29.
- Closes for last time May 15.

The Motto on Our Coins.

On April 22, 1904, the coinage of a two cent bronze piece was authorized by congress. On this coin the motto "In God We Trust" appeared for the first time in lieu of the long standing "E Pluribus Unum." On March 3, 1905, the director of the mint, with the approval of the treasury, was authorized to place the new motto upon all gold and silver coins susceptible of such addition.

Exchange of Trees.

In return for the white pine, the Douglas fir and the black walnut Europe has given North America the Norway spruce and maple and the Scotch and Austria pine.

The Mexican Turkey.

According to the natives, the Mexican turkey in its wild state is not a very intelligent bird, for they declare that the coyotes capture it by running in circles under the trees in which the birds are roosting until the latter get dizzy through watching them and fall down one by one.

Australian Pine Bark.

From Australian pine bark experts have extracted 14 to 40 per cent of tannin against the 8 per cent obtained in England from oak bark.

Caterpillar Barometers.

Caterpillars are good weather prophets, especially those that shelter themselves in webs. When rain is due they stay at home instead of foraging on the leaves of the trees which they inhabit. Their sense of barometrical change is keener than that of the oldest weather prophet.

A Bookmark.

A corner cut out of a large envelope makes a good bookmark, especially useful where several leaves in a book are to be held together.

Coal in India.

India mines over 11,000,000 tons of coal a year.

Nut Butter.

Nut butter is a very good substitute for meat. Run walnuts through a food chopper and rub into them about one-third as much good fresh butter. Spread on crisp crackers.

Tobacco in New Zealand.

New Zealanders consume over seven pounds of tobacco per head each year.

The English Statute Mile.

The English statute mile was first defined in the thirty-fifth year of Queen Elizabeth. Before that time it was put down at 5,000 feet.

A Use For Old Tablecloths.

The best pieces should be cut into squares and carefully hemstitched. These squares do excellently to spread over the cloth where the meat dish stands. A carrier is very apt to soil the part round the dish, and this plan gives a clean cloth a longer lease of life.

The Condor.

The condor is the only bird which keeps its offspring in the nest for a year. The young cannot fly for twelve months after being hatched.

Dried Fish Flavor.

Dried fish is used in Japan for flavoring soups and other foods.

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
