FACTORY IS NEARLY RAZED

FRAME WORK OF STRUCTURE TO GO TO IDAHO.

Entire Plant Less Brick Will Be Shipped Away Soon.

Rapid progress is being made on the contract of razing the sugar factory building to move the machinery and frame work to Idaho where it will be erected hereafter. The steel frame work is to be sent with the machinery and much of the latter has been removed from the building. It will require some little time to clean the place out entirely.

Several attempts to sell the structure were made but not materialized and as a consequence the entire plant, minus the brick probably, will go to the new location in Idaho.

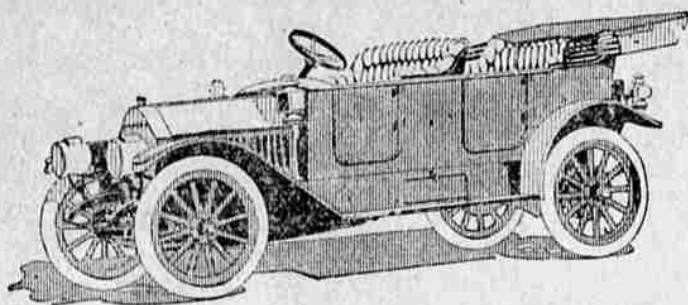
