Junction proceedings filed by the "drys" against the city authorities are finally determined. So far the "drys" have won in the Wallowa circuit court the judge having overruled a demurrer to the complaint of the "drys" who thereupon asked and received permission to voluntarily amend and strengthen their complaint. It has been the expectation that another demurrer would be filed against the new complaint and overruled as a matter of form and then the case would be taken to the supreme court. The Springfield case, if found to be decisive on the points at issue in the Joseph case, may be the cause of being reargued and reconsidered by the court. Interested attorneys declined to make any statement until they could examine the latest decision.
