Train to Leave About 9 O'Clock With 200 or More Aboard.

The La Grande lodge of the Loyal Order of Moose has chartered a special train to leave La Grande Sunday, March 10th, at 9 a. m. for Baker to help initiate 100 new members in the Baker lodge. Arrangements have been made to accommodate 350. A parade of 750 Loyal Moose from various parts of Oregon is first on the program. After the parade a banquet will be served. Later, another banquet will be spread, at which it is expected some of the leading men of the state will speak on subjects of interest to a Loyal Moose.
