CITY TEAM IS EASY VICTOR

HIGHS BEATEN BY WIDE MARGIN
LAST NIGHT.

Teams Disband With Final Game
Played to Small House.

History repeated itself last night when the city five vanquished the high school by a margin that was widened at the very last from 10 points to considerably more than that. Before a mere handful of people the two teams fought it out on a gentlemanly basis, playing hard but clean ball despite the fact that everyone expected fur scratching.

The city team waded in with as good a display of basketball as the quintet has exhibited this year, in fact kept up its united strength to the very end and only occasionally did the highs get on the offensive and get the ball into their own territory. Close guarding prevented field goals except under the merest chances. Bohnenkamp and Ralston dropped the two prettiest baskets for the highs and Hollister with the wicket with a toss from the extreme sidelines that was classy. Lindsey and Woods were the main scoring machines for the sturdy city five and Bolton's stellar throwing from fouls kept the high school crawling upwards gradually. Bolton was the big score getter for the prep. team.

The heavier city team was so firmly knit together with teamwork that at no time could it consistently be stopped yet for all that there were spurts of good basketball on the high school's part, but the game lack ginger and vim and pep.

The teams lined up as follows:
High school—Bohnenkamp, center, (one basket); Lottes, guard (two baskets); Ralston, guard (two baskets); Bolton, forward (five baskets and 7 fouls); Roberts, Reynolds, Crawley and Schofield, forwards. Total 27.
City team—Woods, center (six baskets and three fouls); Hollister, forward (three baskets); Lindsey, forward (six baskets); A. Bean, guard (two baskets); Geddes, guard, (three baskets). Total 43.

"Nig" Hubler has deserved a vote of thanks from city and school teams alike this year for his splendid work as the extra man on the floor. From Milton to Pendleton, to Wallowa, to Union, to Baker and in La Grande he is known as "The squarest official with basketball teams that the teams have seen or worked under." He not only is versed in the finer points of the game but invokes application of the rules with good judgment.

Trunks and "uppers" for both the high school and city team were laid away in moth balls for another seven months or so.

Elgin has elected Jessie Hindman manager of the baseball team of that town this year and already the manager-elect is looking about for new material to fill out possible weak spots in the well balanced squad.
