WALLOWA MILL RUNNING AGAIN

Wallowa, Ore., March 12.—(Special)—The Nibley-Mimnaugh saw mill company started sawing yesterday after a close down since last November when the freezing weather set in. They are a month earlier this year than last in starting up. The logging train and equipment has been put in perfect order for the summer hauling of logs and the crew is making two trips a day with logs from the timber to the mill pond, which is about four miles distant. The mill will cut in the neighborhood of 10,000,000 feet of lumber this season. They have in their employ at the present time between 75 and 100 men, and expect to increase their crew later on in the season.

While the price of lumber is low, there is a good demand for it from this point and the sawmill men anticipate an active season for the lumber trade. With all the mills in operation which market their lumber at Wallowa, it is more than probable that upwards of 30,000,000 feet will be cut and placed on the market from this place.
