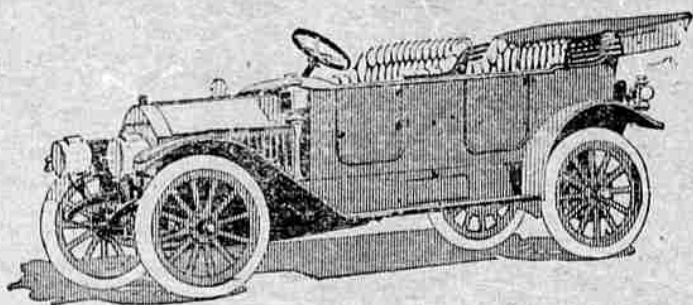

At the general election will be elected, president, vice-president, one United States senator, congressman for new Eastern Oregon district, secretary of state, sheriff, clerk, assessor, treasurer, coroner, surveyor, commissioner, justices of the peace and constables, recorder, superintendent of schools, dairy and food commissioner, railroad commissioner (2nd district) state representative, Union and Walla Walla counties senator from Union and Walla Walla counties, representative from Union County joint senator including Union, Malheur and Morrow counties.
At the primary election parties will nominate for same offices and in addition will express their choice for president and vice president and will elect delegates to their national conventions.
Registration closes on April 3.
Last day for candidates to file nominating petitions, April 4.
Registration reopens April 29.
Closes for last time May 15.
