Madame Le Brun, who appears here April 1, is one of the world's greatest sopranos. She began her musical education at the age of seven. A child prodigy on the piano, she played at leading concerts. With this splendid ground work, she took up voice at 18, studying under Ju'ia Gavarotti in Milan. She also studied under Ugo Angeri, so her studies were all in the pure old Italian school.

Madame Le Brun came to America with the Royal Italian Opera company and played a season in New York. Here, Mr. Henry Savage heard her and engaged her for a three year contract as prima donna of his then English Grand Opera company, after

which she returned to Europe. For the past three years, she has had her own company, as made New York York her headquarters, and has played all the big cities of America.

Over a year ago she went to Germany, where she sang at the Wagner Festival performance at Wurms, as Elsa in "Lohengrin," and as Elizabeth in "Tannhauser" at Innsbruck. She appeared in Karlsruhe a Leonora in "Il Trovatore," and as Marguerite in "Faust" at Nantes, France; also took part in a festival performance at Trieste.

Madame Le Brun has a repertoire of 50 operas and sings them in four languages. Her incomparable vocalism is so perfect that criticism fails.
