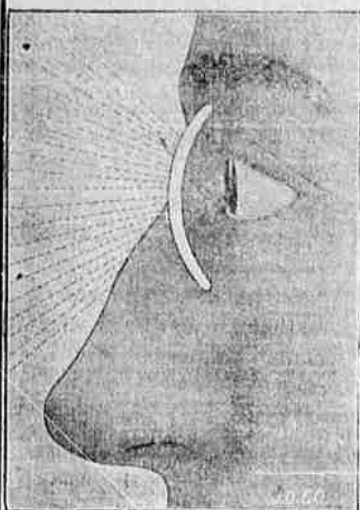

ELKS PLACED ON FUTURE RANGE

GREAT HARDSHIPS SUFFERED BY ESCORTS.

Six Feet of Snow Make Going Hard but Elk Are Unharmed.

Under the greatest difficulties the herd of Jackson Hole elk were finally placed in a corral in Cheamimus pastures last week without harm to the animals but exercise of great hardships to the teams and men, according to State Game Warden W. L.

For a considerable distance after leaving Joseph on the last lap to the ranges, the caravan transporting the elk used wagons to fairly good advantage, but on reaching the higher altitudes snow deepened and it was necessary to transport the elk on sleighs. Six feet of snow was a common occurrence and often the horses were completely buried in the drifts. By tortuous and deliberate progress the caravan reached the pastures and the elk were unloaded in a corral. They will be fed there until the snow melts when they will be turned loose to shift for themselves. No accident marked the trip other than such as were encountered through the deep snow and little or none of this applied itself on the elk.

The game warden and his deputy went on to Portland last evening, thoroughly exhausted in body but satisfied in mind that they had gotten the elk to their destinations from St. Anthony where they received them, in good order.

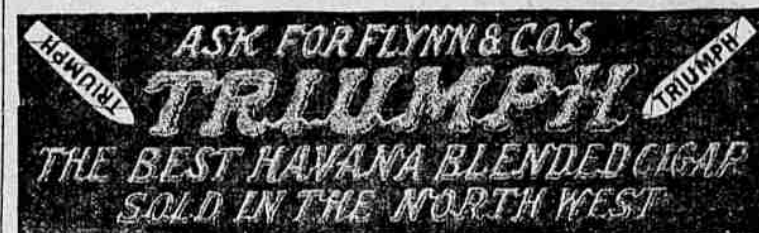
