#### BEN SELLING HONEST.

"I consider Ben Selling one of the straightest men I ever knew in all my life," remarked K. C. Couch, mayor of St. Johns, in discussing the senatorial situation. "I served with him in the legislature, and I know a few things about his ideas of public life that should be known to every voter in Oregon. For instance, on one occasion the Portland Light & Power company was about to place a large order for uniforms for street car employes. The company sent a representative to Ben Selling to see about the contract, and Mr. Selling refused to consider it because he was a member of the legis-

lature. Another time I call to mind when the police department of Portland had a large order for uniforms. Selling again refused to consider it, telling the party carry the message that as long as he was a member of the legislature, he would not think of taking the business. But the case that appealed to me most of all was one time when Governor Benson, deceased, personally went to Selling and stated there were 300 suits of clothes needed for a state institution that it was an emergency order, and there was no time to advertise, and the gov- ernment. I know positively that Selling had in stock exactly what Benson as- ked for, sizes, quality, etc., yet Ben Selling said, 'No, Governor, I cannot conscientiously make such deals, to sell the state goods while I am a mem- ber of the Oregon legislative body.' 'I have the goods you want and I should be well pleased to market them, but I don't think it would be the right thing to do, and I will not consider it.'

"I would like to ask," continued Mayor Couch, "if a man such as I know Ben Selling to be is not thor- oughly entitled to the confidence of the Oregon voters? I think he is."

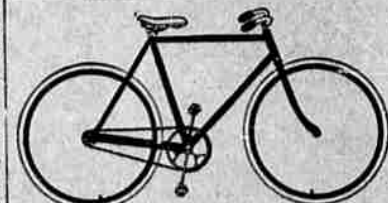

Did you see about the excursion Governor West planned for his man Olcott last Sunday when the Press club of Port- land was invited to junket to Salem and inspect the institutions. But again, the press club was wise, as it always is, and figured out the proposition as it really was. Olcott is running for secretary of state; Olcott managed Governor West's campaign against Bowerman and admits to having spent \$1,500 to assist in that election. West now seeks to repay Olcott and con- tinue the Bourne-Chamberlain-West-Olcott machine which when simmered down means that Old Man Bush, a banker of Salem and a democrat, is running Oregon with two of his bank clerks — West and Olcott — and he wants to continue to do so. The Press club failed to respond in long double headed articles about the "glorious" rip.

Frank Fields is going to land the republican nomination for secretary of state. He took the county clerk's office in Multnomah county when the office was run at a loss of \$6,000 a year to that county and has made it pay a profit to the county of \$30,000 a year ever since his first year, except 1911 when the office paid a profit to the county of \$51,000. That's the kind of a man to help reduce taxes—one who has business sense and less disposition to play politics. If it is economy wanted there is but one man to vote for for secretary of state—Frank

Fields. If you want to continue under the high tax, demagogue rule vote against him.
