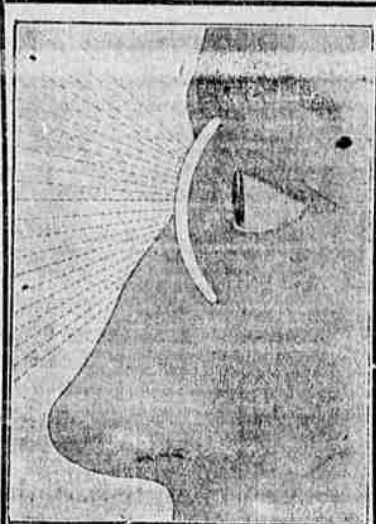

ALIGNMENT KNOWN SOON.

April Third Is Last Day to File Can-
 didacies for County Offices.

By April 3 Union county will know
 precisely who is in the political lime-
 light at the last stretch to the pri-
 mary election. By that time all can-
 didates for county offices must have
 their petitions filed and everything in
 ship shape trim for the final test. In
 the state offices March 29 is the last
 day, and the secretary of state is prob-
 ably now preparing the final ticket as
 it is not likely any candidates will be
 announced after this morning.

Sheriff Frank Childers was on the
 sick list today and was unable to be in
 his office.

BIG TURN OVER MADE.

More Than \$110,000 Is Put Into Treas-
 urer's Hands in a Lump.

Today the sheriff turned over to the
 treasurer an amount of taxes much
 larger than any turnover yet made
 this year. The turn-over amounted to
 \$110,566.16. Rebates allowed this week
 amounted to \$3,174.66 making the to-
 tal tax collected for the week \$113,-
 740.82. The rebates given this week
 are the last of the rebates for this
 year as the time for allowing the 3
 percent rebate has expired.

Taxes are being paid earlier this
 year than they were last year. To
 date the total cash turned over to the
 treasurer amounts to \$251,694.52. To-
 tal rebates allowed \$7,360.72. Total
 tax collected \$259,054.24.
