After Sunday midnight trout fishing will be perfectly all right and the season will be on. While the law will permit anglers to fish it is not probable that many big catches will be recorded yet a while for there are many high streams at this early date. Local fishermen are much elated over the announcement that the hatchery near the confluence of the Wallowa and Grande Ronde rivers is to be employed to stock the streams above it this spring, and every spring in the future, and a way is to be found to screen irrigating ditches. These points were brought out by W. L. Finley, state game warden. In a talk before Enterprise men Saturday night in the court house. Some days before Mr. Finley talked the matter over with Joseph people when he was there on his way to the Chemlumis with the elk.

When the spring run of steel head, or rainbow trout, begins, Mr. Finley plans to devote the hatchery to propagating these fish. The run will come to a close in about a month, and the fingerlings, the small fish, will be distributed in the rivers and creeks. Then a good fishway will be opened in the Wallowa river around the dam and this passage will be left open until late in the summer when the run of chinook salmon begins. To care for this, the dam will be closed for about a month. The small salmon will be released in the lower river, and the waterways again will be opened, and will remain open until spring.

There is no open way around the dam now, nothing can pass the barrier.

In the past the hatchery has been maintained exclusively as a commercial proposition, for the purpose of stocking the lower rivers, particularly the Columbia, with marketable fish.

The prospects for a ball club at Elgin this year are not yet determined accurately according to information from the sister town. It is not known just who the club there will align itself with.
