## ELECTRICIAN TO LECTURE

ELITE THEATRE INTRODUCES A SKILLED SEAMAN.  
Man Who Played Important Part in Battleship Trip, in the City.

One of the chief electricians on the battleship fleet that circled the Horn two years ago, establishing a rare record in ship maneuvers, is in La Grande. His name is Merrian and he and his brother who was a petty officer on the trip, will spend a week here while the elder Merrian takes an active part in a program to be extended over the period of a week at the Elite theatre. The electrician has in his charge a set of moving picture films which take up every phase of the famous trip, and what is more, Mr. Merrian will lecture for 15 minutes every evening the week commencing next Tuesday. He has divided his scenes into such parts as will make it interesting for theatre goers next week. The first portion of the trip will be gone over Tuesday and Wednesday evening. This scene will be run during a 15-minute lecture, and the usual program, of course, is promised.

Commencing on Thursday part two of the lecture and scenes will be taken up and the balance on the next change. In this way it will not be necessary for the patrons to attend every night to hear the connected story. The different chapters handled by Mr. Merrian while appearing at the Elite, are:

No. 1. Description of fleet at Hampton Roads by way of Trinidad, Rio de Janeiro, Valparaiso, Callao, Lima. (Tuesday and Wednesday.)  
No. 2. Target practice, giving a description of weights of shells, powder, charges, construction of torpedoes, and handling of great guns. This is most educational. (Thursday and Friday.)  
No. 3. Honolulu, New Zealand, Australia, Philippine Islands and Manila. (Saturday.)  
No. 4. China, Japan, Ceylon, Suez Canal, Egypt, and Mediterranean sea, Gibraltar and Home. (Sunday and Monday.)
