STATE DEMANDS SHAW'S LIFE

FORMER LA GRANDE NEGRO FACES FATE

Jury Secured and Work is Under Way to Acquit or Convict.

William Shaw, the negro porter in the Foley hotel barber shop for a year or more, and who recently followed his wife, an accomplished graduate of Seattle high school, to Walla Walla, and there shot her, is now fighting for his life in Walla Walla and will probably resort to the insanity route to escape the hangman's knot. The Walla Walla Union of yesterday morning comments on the case:

With the securing of a jury, a task which required all of yesterday afternoon to complete, everything is in readiness for the taking of testimony in the case of William Johnson Shaw who is now on trial in the local superior court for murder in the first degree.

The crime for which Shaw is now being tried, was committed February 27. On that date, Shaw, who lived in La Grande, Oregon, called at the home of Attorney John L. Sharpstein, 431 Lincoln street, where his wife was employed, and after a short quarrel, it is alleged, killed her with a revolver. He then gave himself up to the authorities.

The regular venire of 32 jurors was exhausted before the 12 men necessary to try the case was secured. A special venire of 12 men was then drawn and following this another special venire of 18 men. By this time the state had used five of its six pre-emptories while the defense had used 11 of the 12 pre-emptories allowed them.

At this stage by consent of both sides Sheriff Mike Toner was then empowered to draw an open venire of four men and from this list the 12th and last juror was drawn.

Of all the persons excused, a number rendered themselves ineligible owing to the fact they are opposed to capital punishment. Quite a few were excused owing to the fact that they had read about the case and had formed an opinion in the matter.

The hearing of testimony in the case will start this (Tuesday) morning and should be finished within two days or less. Effort will probably be made by Attorney Frank Garrecht, Shaw's counsel, to prove that the defendant

has inherited tendencies toward insanity, while Prosecuting Attorney E. J. Smith will try to show that Shaw's act was the premeditated act of a perfectly sane man.
