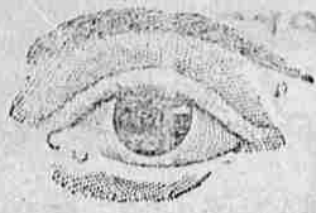

NOTICE OF STREET IMPROVEMENT TO WHOM IT MAY CONCERN: Notice is hereby given that in pursuance of a resolution adopted by the common council of the city of La Grande, Oregon, on the 5th day of April, 1911, creating sewer improvement district No. 2, and designating such district, and in pursuance of a resolution adopted by said common council on the 20th day of March, 1912, whereby said council determined and declared its intention to improve all that portion of section No. 2 in said sewer improvement district as hereinafter described, by laying therein an 8-inch sewer, the council will, ten days after the service of this notice upon the owners of the property affected and benefited by such improvement, order that said above described improvement be made; that the boundaries of said district to be so improved are as follows:
All that portion of section No. 2 in sewer improvement district No. 2.
