## RUN LIGHT WIRE TO ELGIN SOON

JUNE FIRST TO FIND CONSTRUCTION COMMENCED.

Company Plans to Not Work North End of the County This Summer.

By June 1st construction of the Eastern Oregon Light & Power company power and light wires from the slough bridge in the middle of the valley through Alicel, Imbler and on to Elgin will commence, according to announcement made by Superintendent Charles Gore of the local plant today. The company does not intend to go into Wallowa county this year, and its entrance into the Elgin field has led the Elgin Recorder to say:

The city council has granted a franchise to the Eastern Oregon Light & Power company, of Baker City, giving them authority to install a light and power system in the city of Elgin. This is the same company that supplies La Grande, Union and Cove with lights and power, and F. M. Harmon, the manager, claims that the plant will be in operation by the first of next August. They have five power plants in Union and Baker counties. Elgin now has three light and power franchises granted to McCully and Rumble, the Spencer company and the Eastern Oregon Light & Power company. The Recorder is reliably informed that the new franchise will have no effect on the advent of the McCully-Rumble company, with the Wallowa river as the source of its power. It is also understood that a proposition is pending between the E. O. and Mr. Spencer, for the purchase of the franchise, poles and wires of that company. Both the McCully-Rumble and the E. O. are financed by big interests, and the contest between them must be of great benefit to the development of Union and Wallowa counties. The franchise given the E. O. is what is known as a meter franchise and provides for continuous 24 hour service with a maximum rate of 15 cents per kilowatt. So far as the present service is concerned, since Mr. Spencer's franchise was amended there has been no cause for complaint, but the new company will furnish both power and light, as well as night and day service.
