IN KANSAS.

For a real Utopia for women, Kan-
sas modestly hangs out its sign and
says: "Behold, it is here."

No less a personage than the attor-
ney general of Kansas, John S. Daw-
son, says so, and he furnishes the fol-
lowing proof:

In Kansas a woman may retain her
maiden name when she is married.

She may persuade her husband to
give up his name and take her maiden
name.

She may retain her maiden name
and her husband may retain his name.

She may retain her maiden name
for business and take her husband's
name for social intercourse.

She can hold property that her hus-
band cannot touch and may sell it
without asking him anything about it.

She can hold any office, state, coun-
ty or district. There are 80 women
holding county positions and 200 an-
nounced candidates for offices later
on.

She can hold any elective school
district or municipal office. Mrs. EPA

Wilson is mayor of Hunnewell, and
many school boards are managed by
women.

She can wear men's trousers if she
desires, but must not pretend to be a
man. On the other hand, men are
forbidden to wear dresses in public.

There are over 600 women practic-
ing law in Kansas, and over 100 wom-
en physicians. In counties where
women hold office there have been
no scandals or any shortages of ac-
counts. There are no political leeches
hanging about, and employees are cho-
sen for fitness rather than from po-
litical pull.

There are 18 Kansas women manag-
ing farms, five who are presidents of
banks, over 30 who are owners and
managers of big business enterprises,
and many others active in other lines
of business or politics.

Kansas just dotes on being nice to
her women folks.

of those mentioned either specifically
or by general reference two in their
issues of April 12th made brief edi-

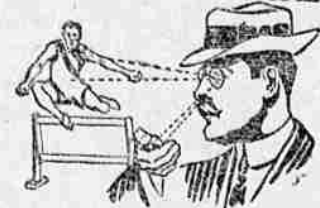
