TO WHOM IT MAY CONCERN: Notice is hereby given that in pursuance of a resolution adopted by the common council of the city of La Grande, Oregon, on the 5th day of April, 1911, creating sewer improvement district No. 2, and designating such district, and in pursuance of a resolution adopted by said common council on the 20th day of March, 1912, whereby said council determined and declared its intention to improve all that portion of section No. 2 in said sewer improvement district as hereinafter described, by laying therein a 3-inch sewer, the council will, ten days after the service of this notice upon the owners of the property affected and benefited by such improvement, order that said above described improvement be made; that the boundaries of said district to be so improved are as follows:

All that portion of section No. 2 in sewer improvement district No. 2. (A) And the property affected or benefited by said improvement is as follows: Beginning at the center of the intersection of Fir street and Jefferson avenue, thence southeasterly along the center line of Jefferson avenue to the center of the intersection of Jefferson avenue with Spruce street, thence northeasterly along the center line of Spruce street 150 feet, thence northwesterly along the southerly boundary of the O. W. R. & N. right of way to its intersection with the center line of Fir street, thence southwesterly along the center line of Fir street to place of beginning.

Notice is hereby further given that the council will levy a special assessment on all the property affected and benefited by such improvement for the purpose of paying for such improvement. That the estimated cost of such improvement is the sum of \$1681.04. That the council will, on the 17th day of April, 1912, meet at the council chamber at the hour of 8 o'clock, p. m., to consider said estimated cost, and the levy of said assessment, when a hearing will be granted to any person feeling aggrieved by such assessment.
