DEADLOCK IN COUNCIL STILL

NO AGREEMENT REACHED AS TO
TRUCK TYPE.

Routine Business Transacted at Regular Meeting Last Night.

Considerable business was transacted by the city council last night at its regular session. One of the important items up for consideration was the matter of selecting a particular type of auto fire trucks but after several ballots had been cast it was found that no agreement could be reached and the deadlock continues.

Action, legal or otherwise, to open Cherry street from the south side of O. W. right of way to North Cherry was ordered.

Mr. Finley has been appointed permanent inspector of the macadam work being done on North Fir. Tom Williamson held the office temporarily.

The new city ordinance removing boxes in all restaurants was reported as being complied with.

Water mains are wanted by petitioners on Washington between Eighth and Spruce and on Cove avenue from Cherry to the city limits. This was referred.

A bid for the construction of the gravel highway was read. J. L. Mars would do the work for \$1,021.

Petitioners living in the vicinity of Cedar and Main, ask for a grade of Cedar from Main to Spring. The petition has been referred. The petition of property owners in North La Grande protesting against the construction of the Grande Ronde Meat company slaughter house was carried over.

Appointment of three men to ap-

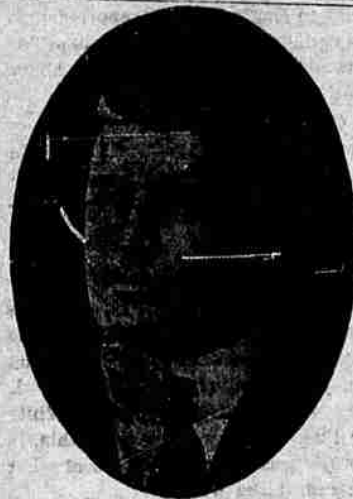
praise the city property that a balance can be struck, came up for consideration. W. H. Bohnenkamp, Frank Phyl and Wm. Miller were appointed. Resolutions calling for new sidewalks, new street grades, and street improvements of various kinds were read. Much of the evening was taken up in this portion of the business.
