The British trades board's act has now been extended to the boxmaking trade. A minimum rate of 6 cents an hour has been fixed, with 52 hours a week, making a weekly wage of \$3.25. This seems an extremely small wage, yet it is a large advance over the miserable pittance which has been paid heretofore by employers.
