Later on, the disgrace came, for the simple reason that hundreds of white men, worthless beyond description, married Indian women for the purpose of securing 640 acres of land, beef, flour, and the regular issues of annuity goods given by a philanthropic government. Visit any of the great reservations, today, and you will find that the whites surrounding the tract have nothing, whatever, to do with a "squaw man," and that the Indians treat him with absolute contempt. One exception to this rule, is a man on the Ute reservation Henderson by name, who claims to be related to one of the wealthiest families in America. He is about 65 years of age and has lived with the Indians for over 40 years. It was just about this time that a brilliant young society man dropped out of view in New York and has never been seen since. It is said that Mr. Royle gained his inspiration for the story, "The Squaw Man," from the story of Henderson.
