SUGAR PRICES DOWN AND OTHERS LIKEWISE.

New Potatoes and Strawberries to Select From Tomorrow.

General slump in butter prices has been the rule in local markets this week and choice creamery brands are now retailing at 35 cents a pound roll. With the exceptions of the meats, there has been a general revision downward in all the necessities and luxuries on the markets for tomorrow's Sunday dinner providers. New potatoes, selling at 10c per pound, and strawberries to help add tone and style to the dinners, are some of the luxuries that the La Grande markets will contain tomorrow.

Portland, April 25.—(Special)—The price of butter in the retail markets is only fractionally greater than half of what it was during the winter months. Extra fancy country creamery butter is today obtainable in the retail shops at 55c to 60c per square of two pounds while at one time during the winter the same amount cost 95 cents. Still another drop is shown in potatoes. This includes both new and old stock.

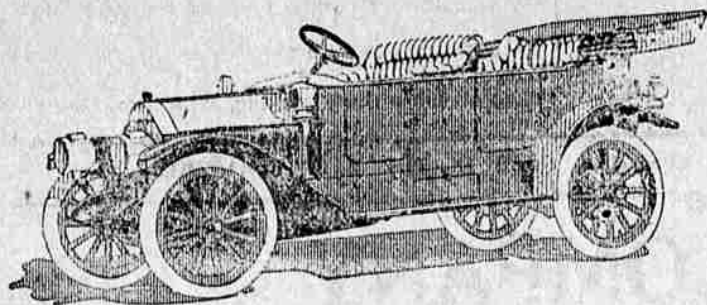
