16 OF 18 UNDER ARREST, FREED

DARLEY AND STEVENSON ONLY
ONES HELD

Second Batch Dismissed Today on the
Hearing Before Justice Williams.

Of the 18 men arrested on complaint
of H. A. Watson for trespassing while
constructing a canal for the Grande
Ronde Irrigation company all but two
have been discharged. A batch of
eight, arrested Saturday for alleged
trespassing on Watson's land, were
placed on trial yesterday evening and
all discharged with the exception of
C. T. Darley and Mr. Stevenson. The
second batch of 10 was tried this
morning before Justice Williams and
all discharged.

Darley and Stevenson were fined
\$25 each but an appeal has been taken.

Issuance of each in the improvement
bond register of said city. Said bonds
shall have distinctly and plainly in-
scribed or printed on the face there-
of, the register number of said bond,
and the words, "Improvement Bonds,"
and the name of the city issuing the
same.

Said bonds shall be in substantially
the following form:

IMPROVEMENT BOND.
KNOW ALL MEN BY THESE

PRESENTS: That the city of La
Grande, in the county of Union and
state of Oregon, for value received
hereby agrees and promises to pay
the BEARER, the sum of FIVE HUN-
DRED DOLLARS in Gold Coin of the
United States of America on the pre-
sentation and surrender of this obli-
gation on the first day of May, in the
year of our Lord, One Thousand Nine
Hundred and Twenty-two, without
grace, with interest thereon from the
date hereof until redeemed or until
the time of the semi-annual interest
payment next ensuing the publication
of notice by the city of La Grande that
this bond will be taken and cancelled,
and that interest thereon will cease
at the interest payment period next
following such publication, at the
rate of six per cent per an-
num payable semi-annually in like
coin on the first day of May and the
first day of November, in each year,
on the presentation and surrender of
the proper coupons hereto annexed.

Principal and interest payable at
the office of the treasurer of the city
of La Grande, Oregon.

This bond is one of a series author-
ized by the acts of the legislative as-
sembly of the state of Oregon for the
issuance of bonds for the improve-
ments of streets and the laying of
sewers in incorporated cities and for
the payment of the cost of such im-
provements by installments and is an
obligation of the city of La Grande
aforesaid and is not to be deemed, or
taken to be within or any part of the
limitations by law as to the indebt-
edness of said city, and it is hereby
certified that all the requirements of
law have been fully complied with by
the proper officers in issuing this
bond and that the total amount of
this issue does not exceed the limits
prescribed by said acts.

This bond is redeemable at the of-
fice of said treasurer at the option of
the city of La Grande upon the pay-
ment of the face value thereof with
accrued interest to the date of the
payment of any semi-annual coupon
period at or after one year from the
date hereof as provided in said acts.
For the fulfillment of the conditions
of this obligation the credit and faith
of the city of La Grande are hereby
pledged.

has been signed by the mayor and at-
tested by the recorder of said city of
La Grande, and the corporate seal
of the city of La Grande affixed this
first day of May, A. D. 1912.

Section 2. Said bonds shall be ad-
vertised for sale by the recorder of
the city of La Grande by publication
thereof in six issues of the La Grande
Evening Observer, and shall be sold
for the highest price obtainable, but
for not less than par and accrued in-
terest. The proceeds derived from
such sale shall be paid by the pur-
chaser to the treasurer of the city of
La Grande and shall be placed by him
to the credit of funds to be known
and designated as "Improvement
Bond Sinking Fund" and "Improvement
Bond Interest Fund," respectively,
subject to disposition as in
Title 26, Chapter V of Lord's Oregon
Laws provided.

Section 3. From and after the pas-
sage and taking effect of this ordi-
nance the mayor and recorder of the
city of La Grande are hereby author-
ized, directed and empowered to cause
to be issued and printed and duly ex-
ecuted improvement bonds of the city
of La Grande, Oregon, in denomina-
tions as hereinbefore stated and of
the form as herein fully set forth, and
in all equal to the total amount of
unpaid assessments for said streets
and avenues for which applications
have been filed as shown by said bond
lien docket.

Section 4. This ordinance shall
take effect from and after its passage,
approval by the mayor and publica-
tion in one issue of the La Grande
Evening Observer.

Passed the common council of the
city of La Grande, this 25th day of
April 1912, by eight councilmen vot-
ing therefor.

were killed and a score injured in a
tornado that swept over three par-
ishes of Louisiana with heavy damage
last night.

London, April 30.—The steamer
Texas, a British owned vessel, was
struck by a torpedo in Smyrna bay
and destroyed. Seventy-seven of the
140 persons aboard are missing and
are believed to be dead.

Washington, D. C., April 30.—Ac-
companied by Secretary Hilles and
the usual escort of secret service men
President Taft departed from the cap-
ital this afternoon for Savannah, to
attend the centennial anniversary of
the Phrean society in that city. He
is scheduled to reach Savannah to-
morrow morning and remain in that
city until Thursday noon, when he
will return to Washington.
