TO WHOM IT MAY CONCERN: Notice is hereby given that in pursuance of a resolution adopted by the Common Council of the City of La Grande, Oregon, on the 12th day of April, 1912, creating Sewer Improvement District No. 1 and designating such district, and in pursuance of a resolution adopted by said Common Council on the 3rd day of April, 1912, whereby said Council determined and declared its intention to improve all that portion of Section No. 3, in said sewer improvement district as hereinafter described, by laying thereon an 8-inch sewer, the Council will, ten days after the service of this notice upon the owners of the property affected and benefited by such improvement, order that said above described improvement be made; that the boundaries of said district to be so improved are as follows:

All that portion of section No. 3 in sewer improvement district No. 1, (A) And all the property affected or benefited by said improvement is as follows: Commencing at the center of the intersection of Spring avenue and Oak street, thence south to the center of Pennsylvania avenue, thence west to the center of Walnut street, thence north to the boundary of section 1, of sewer district No. 1, thence east to the center of Oak street, thence south to the place of beginning.
