LOCALS TAKE SECOND PLACE

SPLENDID MEET, WELL MANAGED, GOES TO BAKER

Millering is Individual Star of Saturday's Track Meet

The Winning Schools Baker 44; La Grande, 31; Pendleton, 24; Enterprise, 20; Athena, 7; Wallowa, 4; Ontario 1. The Union High School had a team entered but they failed to make a point.

Breasted at the finish and shunted into second place when sailing was smooth for first honors, La Grande's track and field team is home from the annual classic test at Baker last Saturday. Perfectly satisfied with the management and praising Archie Hahn's administrative abilities and the meet as a whole, the locals have only one regret at losing the meet, and that is that the point-winning members of the local team were of necessity required to enter several events at the same time, cutting off points. Some men were in four events at one time.

Clean Sweep in Vaults La Grande made a clean sweep in the pole vault, and many an event was hotly contested. The high hurdles were won by Millering after a brilliant race between Fee of Pendleton and Millering, the latter finishing a few feet to the good by a final spurt at the tape. Roberts was a consistent point winner throughout the meet, running in fine form and losing first place in the dashes by inches.

Millering Meet's Star Manager Millering captured the individual points medal, though Baker papers give it to a Baker man. Millering, Conkey and Roberts tied in the pole vault, or rather failed to jump it off, the two last named conceding the event to Millering. Given credit for five points in this event, Millering's score would be 14 but he compromised with the officials at 12 points, who tried to count the relay as 1 1/4 points for Malone, the nearest competitor. This was overruled and Millering was given the medal.

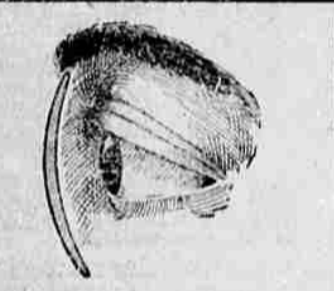
