TO WHOM IT MAY CONCERN: Notice is hereby given that in pursuance of a resolution adopted by the Common Council of the City of La Grande, Oregon, on the 17th day of April, 1912, creating Improvement District No. 47 and designating Eighth Street, as such district, and in pursuance of a resolution adopted by said Common Council on the 17th day of April, 1912, whereby said Council determined and declared its intention to improve all that portion of Eighth Street, in said improvement district as hereinafter described, by laying thereon cement walk on east side, the Council will, ten days after the service of this notice upon the owners of the property affected and benefited by such improvement, order that said above described improvement be made; that the boundaries of said district to be so improved are as follows: All that portion of Eighth Street from the south curb line of "N" Avenue, to the north curb line of "M" Avenue.

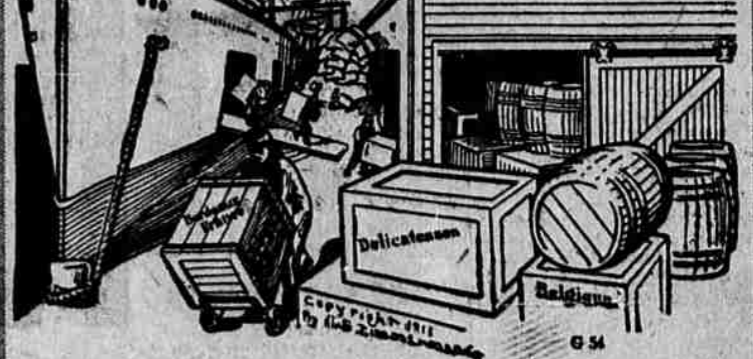
