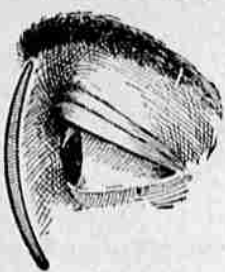

MISSIONARY JURISDICTION OF EASTERN OREGON TO MEET

Bishop Wells of Spokane and Bishop Paddock to Be Present

St. Peter's parish of this city is preparing to entertain the fifth annual convocation of the Missionary Jurisdiction of Eastern Oregon, which meets here next Tuesday and Wednesday. All the clergy, with no exception, expect to be present, and Bishop Wells of Spokane, will come at the invitation of Bishop Paddock to preach the convocation sermon on Wednesday morning. More particulars will be announced later.

NOTICE OF STREET IMPROVEMENT

TO WHOM IT MAY CONCERN: Notice is hereby given that in pursuance of a resolution adopted by the Common Council of the City of La Grande, Oregon, on the 12th day of April, 1911, creating Sewer Improvement District No. 1 and designating such district, and in pursuance of a resolution adopted by said Common Council on the 3rd day of April, 1912, whereby said Council determined and declared its intention to improve all that portion of Section No. 3, in said sewer improvement district as hereinafter described, by laying thereon an 8-inch sewer, the Council will, ten days after the service of this notice upon the owners of the property affected and benefited by such improvement, order that said above described improvement be made; that the boundaries of said district to be so improved are as follows:

All that portion of section No. 3 in sewer improvement district No. 1. (A) And all the property affected or benefited by said improvement is as follows: Commencing at the center of the intersection of Spring avenue and Oak street, thence south to the center of Pennsylvania avenue, thence west to the center of Walnut street, thence north to the boundary of section 1, of sewer district No. 1, thence east to the center of Oak street, thence south to the place of beginning.

Notice is hereby further given that the Council will levy a special assessment on all the property affected and benefited by such improvement for the purpose of paying for such improvement. That the estimated cost of such improvements is the sum of \$1609.62. That the Council will, on the 15th day of May, 1912, meet at the Council chamber at the hour of 8 P. M. to consider said estimated cost, and the levy of said assessment, when a hearing will be granted to any person feeling aggrieved by such assessment.

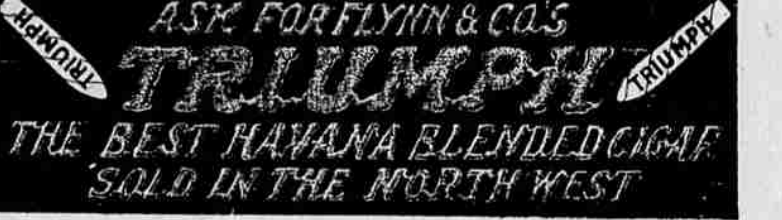

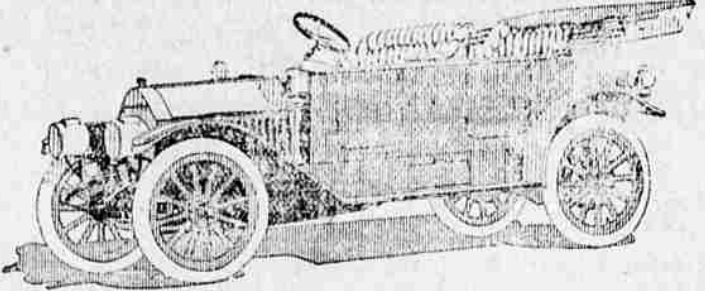
