TO WHOM IT MAY CONCERN: Notice is hereby given that in pursuance of a resolution adopted by the Common Council of the City of La Grande, Oregon, on the 3rd day of April, 1912, creating improvement district No. 56 and designating Main avenue as such district and in pursuance of a resolution adopted by said Common Council on the 17th day of April, 1912, whereby said Council determined and declared its intention to improve all that portion of Main Avenue in said improvement district as hereinafter described by laying thereon Gravel Bitulithic pavement, 40 feet in width, with full street intersections and constructing cement curbs, the Council will, ten days after the service of this notice upon the owners of the property affected and benefitted by such improvement order that said above described improvement be made; that the boundaries of said district to be so improved are as follows:

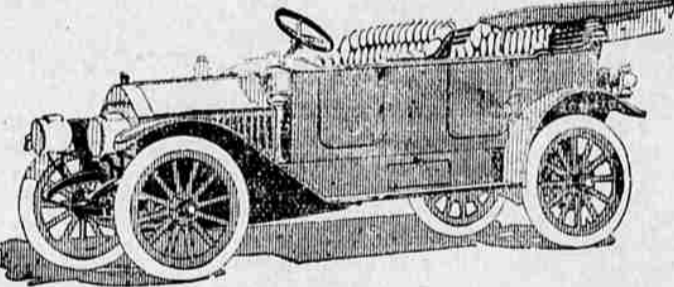
