

## ENTRIES TAKE FIVE YEARS

of the entryman.

The circular is known as "Circular No. 99" and copies may be obtained from the local land office on request.

It reads in part as follows:

"An entryman under section 2289, revised statutes, who makes an additional entry under section 3 of the enlarged homestead act, may continue both residence and cultivation upon the original entry, but final proof may not be made for the land embraced in the additional entry until full compliance with the requirements of said act has been effected beginning with the date of such additional entry. Final proof must be made on the original entry within the statutory period of seven years.

"The cultivation required in such cases is an amount equal to one-eighth and one-fourth of the area embraced in the additional entry, commencing with the second and third years, respectively of such additional entry. If such proportionate area, or any part thereof, is of land embraced in original unperfected entry, there must be such additional cultivation of the original entry as would ordinarily be required to perfect title thereto if it stood alone.

"Prior to the designation of land as subject to entry under the enlarged homestead act, a settlement right be acquired to not more than approximately 160 acres of unsurveyed land

and should such settlement claim be extended, after all the land involved has been designated as subject to entry under the act, to embrace additional land with a view to entry under the said act, title may be acquired to the enlarged area only by continued residence, and cultivation as required by section 4 of the act, for the full period after the date of designation and extension of settlement.

"All former instructions not in harmony with the foregoing are vacated, and superseded hereby."

## NOTICE OF STREET IMPROVEMENT

TO WHOM IT MAY CONCERN: Notice is hereby given that in pursuance of a resolution adopted by the Common Council of the City of La Grande, Oregon on the 3rd day of April, 1912, creating improvement district No. 55 and designating Washington avenue as such district and in pursuance of a resolution adopted by said Common Council on the 17th day of April, 1912, whereby said Council determined and declared its intention to improve all that portion of Washington Avenue in said improvement district as hereinafter described by laying thereon Gravel Bitulithic pavement, 23 feet in width, with full street intersections and constructing cement curbs, and constructing drainage, the Council will ten days after the service of this notice upon the owners of the property affected and benefited by such improvement order that said above described improvement be made; that the boundaries of said district to be so improved are as follows:

All that portion of Washington Avenue from the east line of Fir Street to the west line of Twelfth Street, and the property affected or benefited by said improvement is as follows:

Commencing at the northeast corner of Block 99, Chaplin's Addition to the City of La Grande; thence west to the alley through said block, thence south to the center of said block, thence east to the middle of the east line of said block, thence to the southwest corner of block 100, thence east to the alley running through said block, thence to a point on the north line of block 63, 10 feet east of the northeast corner of lot 3, block 63, thence south to the alley running through block 63, thence east to the northeast corner of lot 8, block 63, thence south to the south line of said block, thence east to the northeast corner of lot 2, block 16, Coggan's Addition, thence south to the center of said block, thence east to the middle of the east line of said block; thence to the northwest corner of lot 3, block 11 of said addition, thence south to the southwest corner of said block; thence to the northeast corner of lot 2, block 15; thence south to the center line east and west of said block; thence east to the middle of the east line of said block; thence to the southwest corner of block 12, Coggan's Addition; thence to the northeast corner of lot 2, block 14 of said addition; thence south to the center line, east and west of said block; thence east to the middle of the east line of said block; thence to the southwest corner of block 13, thence east to Washington avenue, thence to the alley on the line between lots 4 and 5, block W of Coggan's 2nd addition to the alley running northwest and southeast through said block, thence northwest to Fir street, thence to the place of beginning.

Notice is hereby further given that the Council will levy a special assessment on all the property affected and benefited by such improvement for the purpose of paying for such improvement. That the estimated cost of such improvement is the sum of \$18,133.00. That the Council will, on the 15th day of May, 1912, meet at the Council chamber at the hour of 8 P. M., to consider said estimated cost, and the levy of said assessment, when a hearing will be granted to any person feeling aggrieved by such assessment.
