BAD FIELDING LOSES GAME

BOISE TAKES REVENGE FOR THE FIRST DEFEAT.

Three Pitchers Again Work for La Grande With No Support.

Stinging vengeance was exercised by Hugh Kellackey and his cohorts yesterday, taking the third game of the series here from La Grande by the lop-sided score of 17 to 4. Boise misused three La Grande pitchers, although they had less luck in chastising Etchandy than any of the other two that worked. Etchandy's support was enormously rotten and ragged. With the possible exception of Walters and Cosgriff in the infield, "everybody was doing it" scandalously often. McConnell, a brick hued mound artist from Boise, was delegated the pitching task but Kellackey didn't like the way he was working and put Crutchfield on the hill about the same time that McInnis was chased. Boise scored five runs on six hits in the first inning and from then on the big Frenchman would have held them down nicely with the support that La Grande accorded its pitchers the day before. Three double plays added a little spice to the match in fact Boise's fielding was always a feature. Jansen had six assists.

Crutchfield Was Good.
Kellackey's representative on the mound was all to the good and although La Grande hit for a total of five hits, they were scattered and Hughie is well pleased with the way Crutchfield behaved.

As the game progressed La Grande lost its unity, what little it did have, and played loose, ragged ball with no effort at team work and the consequence was a heart breaking and sorrowful game for the La Grande rooters.
