## NEW BY LAWS ARE ADOPTED

### MEMBERSHIP BASIS CREATED BY CHAUTAUQUA.

Season Membership Costs \$10 and Buys Four Jekets.

New By-Laws of the Grande Ronde Chautauqua association were adopted this week and materially change the general scheme of finances. The association will henceforth have a specific membership and holders of one-ticket admissions cannot participate in the administering of affairs as now. The text of the by-laws follows:

#### Article 1—Membership

Anyone over the age of twenty-one years may become a member of this association by paying a membership fee of Ten (\$10.00) Dollars, which membership fee shall keep member in good standing for the year in which the same is paid, and said membership fee shall entitle said member to four (4) season tickets to the annual Chautauqua Assembly, or its equivalent in half tickets. All members shall have the privilege of one vote at all membership meetings of the association.

#### Article 2.—Dues.

The membership fee paid upon admission into the membership of this association shall be considered as the first year's dues. Thereafter the dues of this association shall be Ten (\$10.00) per year and said dues shall entitle the member to the same tickets to the annual assemblies of this association as does the membership fee.

#### Article 3.—Officers.

Section 1. There shall be elected by the members of this association nine (9) trustees, as provided in the Articles of Incorporation, and each member shall be entitled to one vote for said officers.

Sec. 2. Said trustees shall elect from their own number a president, vice-president and secretary and may elect such other officer as they desire.

Sec. 3. The president shall be the executive officer of the association, shall preside over all meetings of the trustees and members; sign all warrants upon the treasury and perform such other duties as the Board of Trustees may require or as may appertain to his office.

Sec. 4. The vice president shall assist the president in the performance of his duties, and in his absence have full authority to act in his place and stead.

Sec. 5. The secretary shall keep all of the minutes of the Board of Trustees and members of this association; he shall sign all warrants upon the treasury with the president and perform such other duties as the Board of Trustees may from time to time require or as may appertain to his office.

Sec. 6. The Board of Trustees may elect a Treasurer who shall keep accurate account of all money received and expended by the association, make due report thereof and perform such other duties as the Board of Trustees may from time to time direct.

#### Article 4.—Vacancies

The Board of Trustees shall have the power to appoint any duly qualified person to fill any office of this association for any unexpired term, and in case any trustee of this association fails to attend any of the meetings of the Board of Trustees of this association for three consecutive times, then his office may be declared vacant by the Board of Trustees and said Board of Trustees may at its option, appoint any other duly qualified person to fill said vacancy.

#### Article 5.—Annual Assemblies.

Sec. 1. Annual assemblies of this association at which programs of an educational nature shall be rendered, shall be held one each year at such time as the Board of Trustees may at any meeting of said Board designate.

Sec. 2. The admission fee to said Annual Assemblies shall be by ticket, which shall be of four classes: the first class—season ticket; second class—season half ticket for children under sixteen years of age and over eight; third—single admission tickets and fourth—single admission half tickets for children under sixteen years of age and over eight. The price of said tickets shall be such as the Board of Trustees shall designate for each and every assembly. All children under eight years of age shall be admitted free.

#### Article 6.—Concessions

At no time will there be allowed upon the grounds of this association any fire-crackers or noise making toys or utensils, but the Board of Trustees may grant concessions for stands, store and restaurants upon such terms as said Board of Trustees may designate for each assembly.

#### Article 7.—Order of Business

The following shall be the order of business at the meetings of the Board of Trustees of this association:

First. Reading of minutes of last meeting.

Second. Reports of Committees.

Third. Unfinished business.

Fourth. New business.

#### Article 8.

These By-Laws may be amended at any time by a unanimous vote of the Board of Trustees, or upon the giving of one month's notice of the proposed amendment by a two-thirds vote of the Board of Trustees.

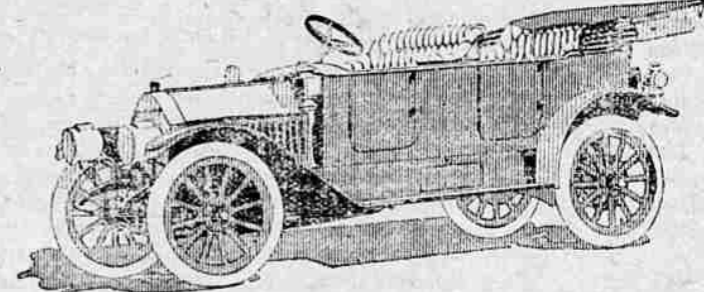
