STATE PRISON INMATES FROM HERE FLEE.

Minor Offenses Punished by Term in Prison Not Explained.

Among other things Union county has had a clean record at Salem—none of her prisoners have escaped, but that record is smashed now, which the following dispatch from Salem indicates:

Evidently longing for more freedom than that which they could avail themselves of under Governor West's "honor system" three "honor men" fled under cover of darkness last night and up till noon yesterday had not been apprehended.
They had been assigned to the asylum farm, and the discovery of their flight was not made until this morning. They were: H. Raymond, serving a term for larceny from a dwelling; Claude Franklin, serving a term for receiving stolen property, and A. Kendall, serving a term for burglary, all from Union county. This considerably augments the list of "honor men" who have effected their escape since Governor West inaugurated his "honor system."

GROTESQUE DANCES.

Yaqui Natives Wear Antlers and Jump Like Deer.

Natives of the Yaqui region in Mexico make use of queer costumes in their dances. Seated on the ground around a fire, four good singers chant dialogues between the deer and other animals and birds, such as the coyote, the jaguar, the wolf, the bear, the eagle and the hawk. Their music is made by beating with small sticks, saturated in blood and then dried, on "güegas" or tightly stretched mats of plaited tule leaves.

The dancer ties on his head the skin and horns of the head of a deer—which is often better than his own—and from his belt of deer hide hang many deer hoofs, which rattle continuously as he goes through the steps of the dance. In his hands he carries two large rattles, made of gourds partly filled with pebbles. These he also shakes to keep time to the music.

The dancer tries to imitate, as far as possible, the movements of the deer. He shakes himself sideways and with his hands makes motions similar to those of the deer's long white tail as the animal goes running swiftly over the plain, leaping through the underbrush or trying to free himself from the flies which infest the valleys of the mountains. He whirls around, jumps and leaps straight up and down into the air. When we are least expecting it another person appears, wearing the head of a coyote, a bear or a puma, chases the deer, tries to bite him, leap on his back or otherwise bear him to the ground, but the deer always escapes.—Cleveland Plain Dealer.

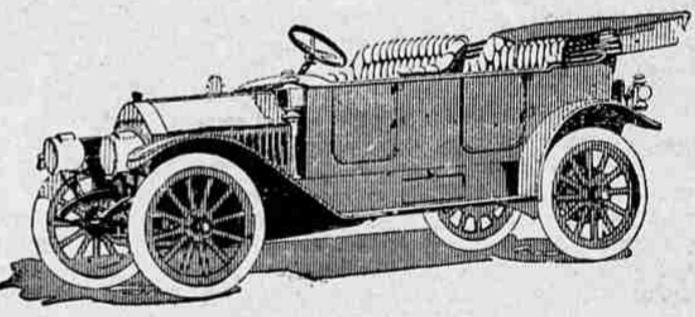
